Richard Edward "Rick" Litten, 62, of Woodstock, passed away at home Wednesday morning, October 24, 2018, after a long illness.

Born June 12, 1956 in Winchester, and raised in Fairfax, Rick was the son of James P. Litten and the late Odessa Kipps Litten.

Survived by his loving wife, Kathryn "Kathy" Smyth Litten, and her son John P. Shiflett of Pittsburg, PA.

Educated at Shenandoah University, Rick employed his musical and theatrical talents in many facets and venues throughout his career and retirement. He also served as music director for St. John Bosco Parish, Woodstock, for several years.

Beyond his faith and love of music, Rick was well-known as an avid Redskins fan. A member of the Knights of Columbus, Council 9002, Woodstock, Rick later held the position of deputy grand knight prior to falling ill.

Gifted with a keen sense of humor, Rick could be counted on to appreciate and readily share the lighter side of any situation.

Rick is also survived by his beloved extended family, many friends, and by his menagerie of housecats.
